Key rule: In English, questions are formed by putting the **auxiliary verb** (do/does/did, am/is/are) **BEFORE** the subject. "Do you like pizza?" (not "You like pizza?")

Question Types (A1)

Type	Start with	Example
Yes/No	Do/Does/Did + subject	Do you like music?
Yes/No (continuous)	Am/Is/Are + subject	Are you playing football?
What	What + auxiliary + subject	What do you like?
Where	Where + auxiliary + subject	Where do you live?
When	When + auxiliary + subject	When do you wake up?
How	How + adjective/many/much	How old are you?
How many/much	How many/much + noun	How many brothers do you have?

Present Simple Questions

Do/Does + subject + base verb?

Do I/you/we/they + verb? · **Does** he/she/it + verb?
Examples: Do you play football? · Does she like chocolate? · What do they eat?

Present Continuous Questions

Am/Is/Are + subject + verb-ing?

Am I + verb-ing? · **Is** he/she/it + verb-ing? · **Are** you/we/they + verb-ing?

Examples: Are you playing now? · Is she cooking?

Past Simple Questions

Did + subject + base verb?

Examples: Did you go to school? · Did she eat breakfast? · What did they do yesterday?

Wh- Questions

Question word	Asks about	Example
What	thing/object	What do you like?
Where	place/location	Where do you live?
When	time	When is your birthday?
Who	person	Who is your teacher?
Why	reason	Why do you like music?
How	manner/quantity	How do you go to school?
How many	countable quantity	How many books do you have?
How much	uncountable quantity	How much money do you have?

 **Tip:** For all question types, the order is: **Question word + auxiliary + subject + verb**. If it's a Yes/No question, there's no question word — just start with the auxiliary.
